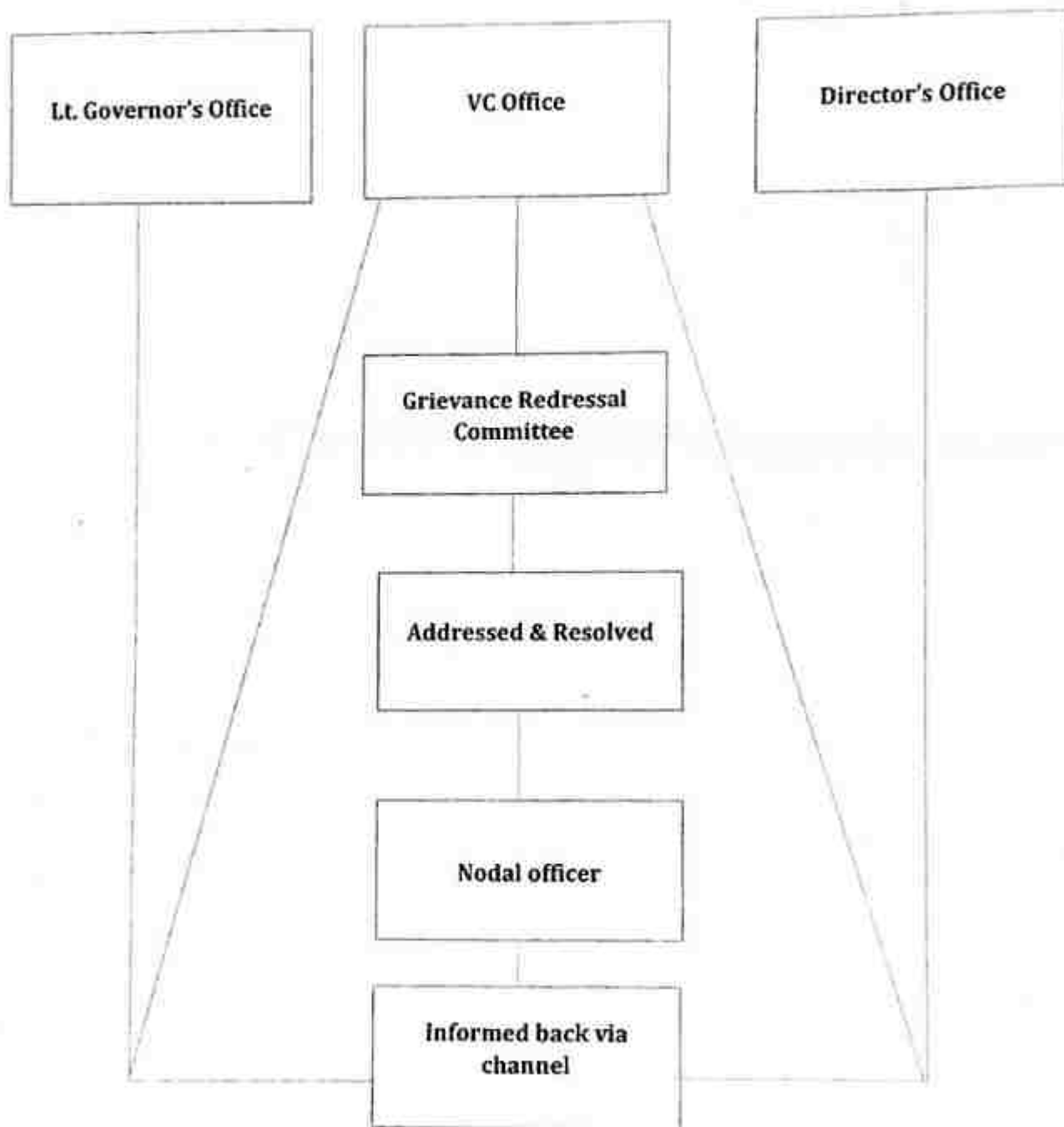

5. The study centre shall be provided with the following part-time staff :
 1. Principal, Govt. Degree College, Kathua (Overall Incharge)
 2. Coordinator
 3. Clerk-cum-Library Assistant
 4. Orderly-cum-Library Attendant
 5. Chowkidar
 6. Sweeper
6. The part-time staff shall be paid remuneration as may be prescribed by the university from time to time.
7. All purchases of books, furniture, fixtures, stationery and audio-video components, etc. for the study centre shall be made by the DDE with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor in accordance with the norms of the University of Jammu.
8. The students who opt for utilising the services of the study centre shall be delivered study materials of their respective courses through the centre.
9. The students of the study centre shall submit their assignments and other documents to the DDE through the centre.
10. An advance of Rs. 1000/- shall be placed at the disposal of the Coordinator for incurring expenditure for meeting contingencies. The Coordinator shall be authorised to incur expenditure upto Rs. 50/- at a time in meeting day-to-day contingencies of the study centre subject to the maximum of Rs. 500/- per month. The Coordinator, however, shall have to incur all such expenditure in consultation with the Principal of the College subject to the subsequent sanction by the competent authority of the university, as per rules.

11. An amount of Rs. 200/- per month shall be allowed on account of telephone charges.
 12. The arrangement of the following shall be made by the Coordinator at the study centre :
 - i) organisation of contact-cum-counselling classes for various courses ;
 - ii) conduct of practicals in the courses involving practical work;
 - iii) reference library;
 - iv) information about the academic programmes of the DDE;
 - v) audio-video replay facilities;
 - vi) conduct of examinations.
 13. The contact-cum-counselling sessions shall be organised by the Coordinator of the study centre. The number of counselling sessions shall vary from course to course based on general requirements of the students as well as the content of the syllabus. However, in subjects where the enrolment is upto 10 students only, maximum of 8 counselling sessions shall be conducted. In the subjects where number of students is more than 10, 16 to 20 contact-cum-counselling sessions shall be held in an academic year.
 14. The study centre shall remain open for the students atleast two to three hours on each working day as per the timings to be jointly decided by the Coordinator and the Overall Incharge of the Study Centre.
 15. Contact-cum-counselling classes will be held in various subjects on Sundays and Holidays. Each contact-cum-counselling session shall be of the duration of 2 hours.
 16. The academic counsellors who will engage contact-cum-counselling classes shall be paid remuneration as per the rates already approved by the university for the conduct of contact classes of the DDE.

FUNCTIONS AND ROLE OF PRINCIPAL/OVERALL INCHARGE
OF THE STUDY CENTRE

1. The Principal, Govt. Degree College, Kathua shall be ex-officio Overall Incharge of the study centre.
2. The Overall Incharge is expected to render full cooperation in providing accomodation for the office of the study centre, class rooms, etc.
3. The Overall Incharge is expected to give appropriate instructions to the non-teaching staff of the College to extend their full cooperation to the Coordinator and Counsellors for the smooth functioning of the study centre.
4. The Overall Incharge shall periodically inspect the study centre to ensure smooth functioning of the centre.
5. The Overall Incharge shall forward the applications of lecturers of the College for appointment of academic Counsellors alongwith his specific recommendations.
6. The Overall Incharge shall countersign the remuneration bills of the Counsellors and other bills relating to the study centre.
7. The Overall Incharge shall act as Inspector-cum-Overall Incharge for the examinations of the students of the study centre.
8. If the Coordinator of the centre is transferred, the Principal will make alternative arrangement till the appointment of a new part-time Coordinator.

FUNCTIONS AND ROLE OF COORDINATOR

1. The Coordinator shall be executive head of the study centre. He shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor initially for a period of 3 years. Extension of his further period of 2 years shall be considered by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendations of the Principal, Govt. Degree College, Kathua and the Director (DDE) on his satisfactory performance. If the teacher appointed as Coordinator is transferred during the term of his appointment, another teacher/senior Counsellor shall be appointed as Coordinator in accordance with the procedure mentioned above.
2. The Coordinator shall conduct all correspondence pertaining to the study centre with the DDE and others concerned.
3. The Coordinator shall prepare counselling schedule for various courses in consultation with the Overall Incharge and keep the students and the counsellors informed of the schedule so framed.
4. The Coordinator in consultation with the Overall Incharge shall identify the resource persons for engaging contact-cum-counselling classes for the students of the study centre and send their names to the DDE through Overall Incharge for appointment.
5. The Coordinator may arrange selling of prospectus-cum-admission forms of various courses of the Directorate duly supplied to him by the DDE on prescribed cost and also accept the admission forms and fee duly filled by the admission seekers, on behalf of the DDE subject to scrutiny and finalising their admission to the respective courses by the DDE.
6. The Coordinator shall arrange transmission of the admission ^{6/1/1975} ~~seekers~~ received in the study centre

- from time to time, in the manner as may be mutually agreed upon by the Coordinator and the Director(DDE).
7. The Coordinator shall function under the immediate supervision of the Principal and under the overall control of the Director (DDE). He shall sign all papers pertaining to the study centre.
 8. The Coordinator shall exercise general supervision and control over the administrative and academic staff of the study centre.
 9. The Coordinator shall be responsible for the safety and maintenance of the books, equipments, furniture, stores, stock registers and other properties of the University of Jammu at the study centre. He shall maintain safely attendance registers of administrative and academic staff, accounts and cash books etc.
 10. The Coordinator shall advise, guide and clarify the doubts of the students of the study centre.
 11. The Coordinator shall sign on the identity cards of the students.
 12. The Coordinator shall be responsible to keep the study centre open on the days fixed for the conduct of contact classes and assign work to the counsellors on specified dates.
 13. The Coordinator shall arrange for the continuous interaction between the counsellor and the students.
 14. The Coordinator shall adopt all measures for the maintenance of academic standard at the centre. He shall impress upon the students the importance of regular attendance in contact-cum-counselling sessions.
 15. The Coordinator shall collect the assignments from the students for correction by the counsellors and shall maintain record of the assignments.
 16. The Coordinator shall keep the Director DDE informed through periodic reports about the functioning of the centre.

17. Any complaint/suggestions concerning the course material given by the counsellors of the students shall be forwarded by the Coordinator to the Director (DDE).
18. Any other work that may be assigned to him by the Principal/Director (DDE) from time to time.

ROLE AND FUNCTIONS OF THE ACADEMIC COUNSELLORS

The functions of the academic counsellors are different from a class-room teacher. An academic counsellor has to perform the role of a tutor, counsellor and evaluator. As a tutor, he helps the learners in the better understanding of the course material. As a counsellor, he inculcates confidence in the learners to undertake study through distance education mode and as an evaluator, he helps the learners in self-assessment and self progress. As such, an academic counsellor should possess upto date and sound knowledge of his subject and right attitude for performance of his functions effectively. He must have faith in the distance teaching system. He has to thoroughly read and assimilate the course material so that he may explain it ⁱⁿ limited face to face contact hours. He should be well conversant with different concepts and operational aspects of distance teaching system and should show his concern for quality in distance education. The following are the main functions of academic counsellors.

1. He has to clarify the subject related doubts and explain difficult concepts in the contact-cum-counselling sessions.
2. He has to encourage learners to read the learning materials on their own and develop study skills.
3. He has to specify the learning requirements of the subject.

4. He has to present the course material in a synoptic form to the learners.
5. He has to help in updating the contents of learning materials, where necessary.
6. He has to assist learners to make use of audio video materials.
7. He has to mitigate the feelings of isolation of distance learners by his interactions with them.
8. He has to render general advice to the distance learners on courses of study, selection of optionals, pace of study, time-management etc.
9. He has to assist learners in sustaining their interest during the course of their studies.
10. He has to assist learners to prepare assignments' responses.
11. He has to guide the learners in preparing for examination.
12. He has to assist learners' performance by evaluating their assignments and giving his detailed comments on assignments.
13. He has to help the DDE in the conduct of examinations.
14. He has to send his suggestions to the DDE for incorporating required changes in the content *and* format of the learning materials.

AUTHORITY TO INTERPRET THE GUIDELINES

The Vice-Chancellor shall have the authority to interpret the said guidelines and his interpretation shall be final. The Vice-Chancellor shall also have the power to take decision/action in the cases not covered under the said guidelines.

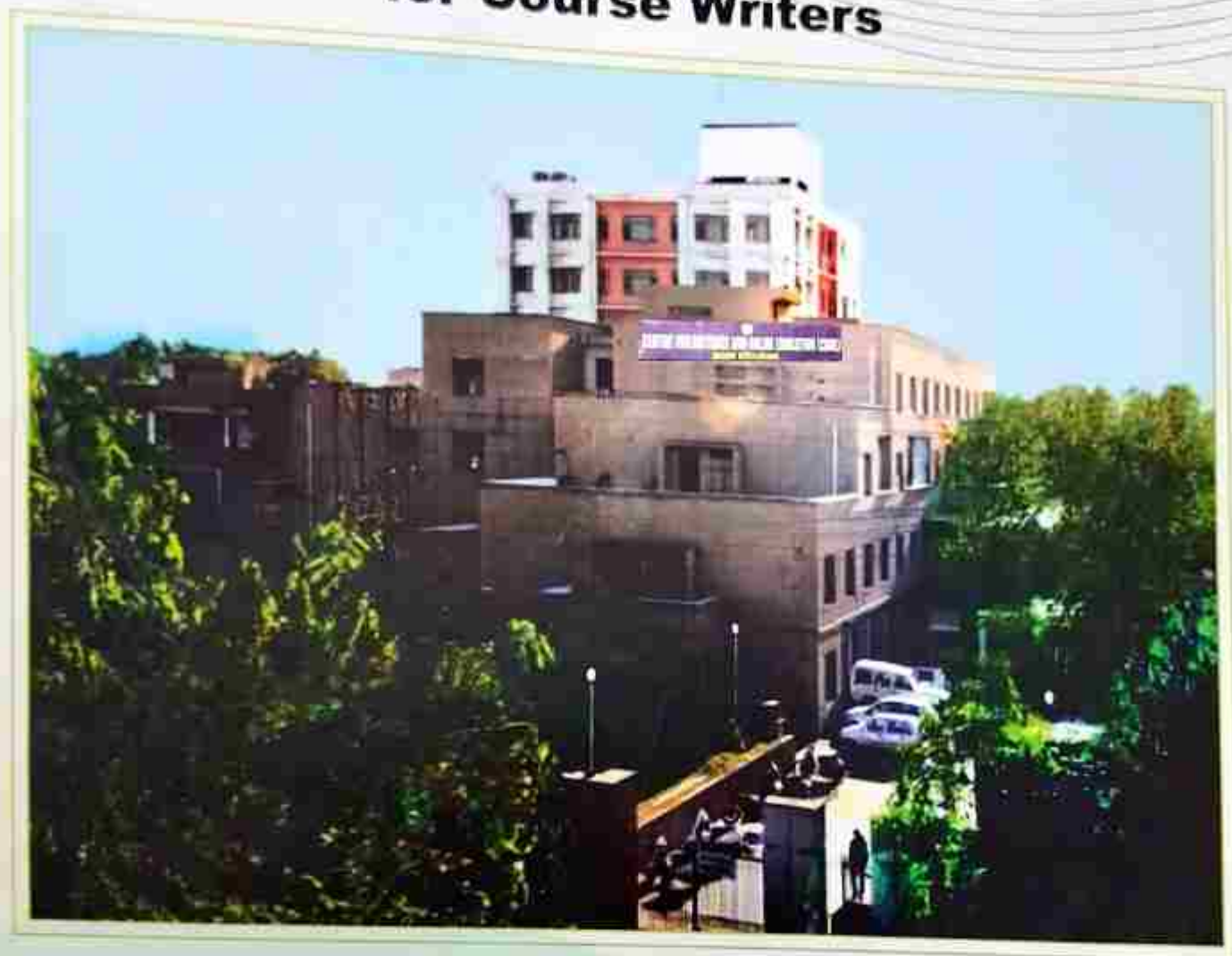

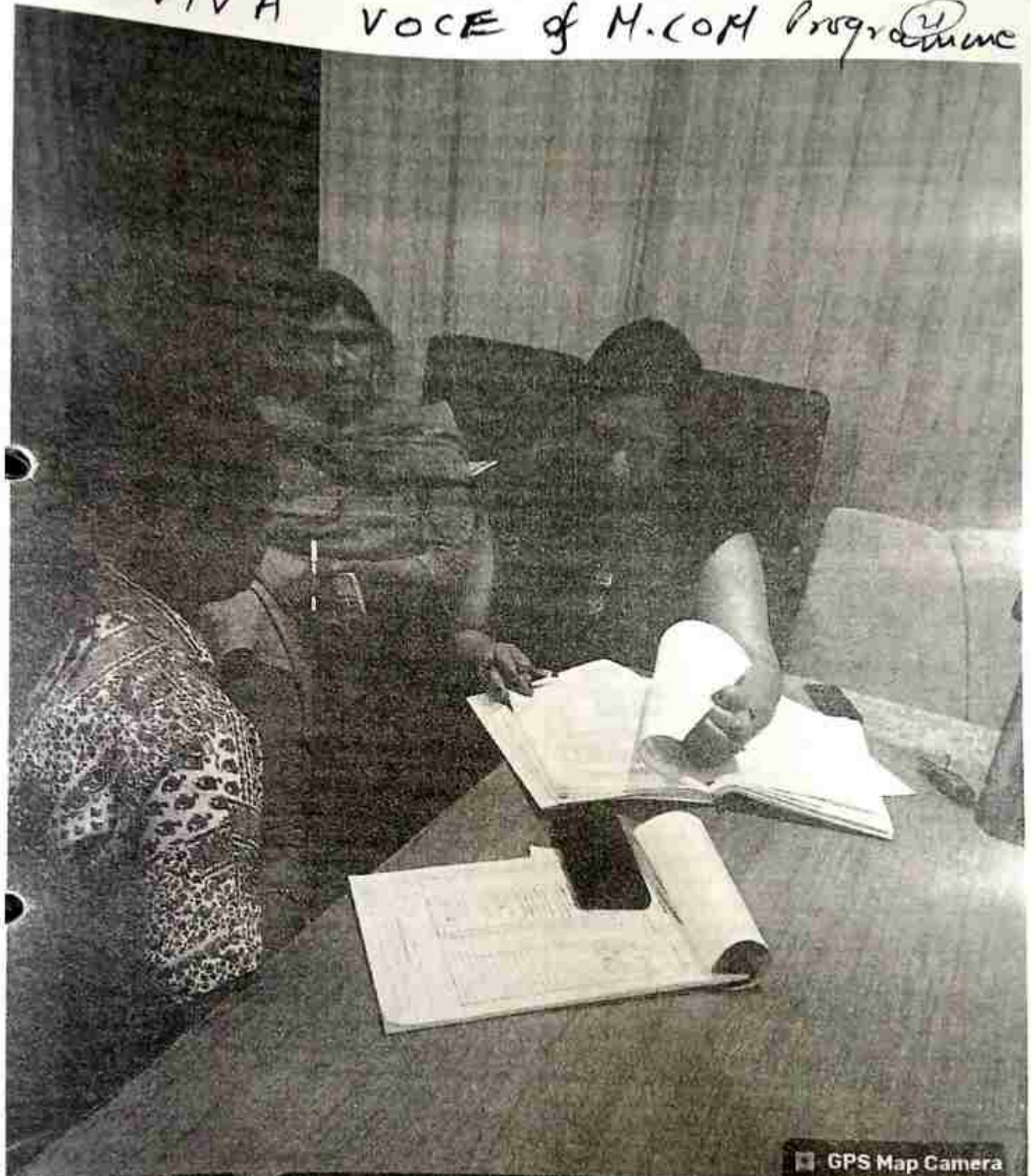

In addition, NIELIT will offer selected courses to CDOE learners free of cost, subject to mutually agreed terms and conditions. To support the effective implementation of the programmes, NIELIT will also provide teaching and technical resources for training activities conducted at the premises of CDOE.

The agreement was signed through the Registrar, University of Jammu, Jammu, on behalf of the University and the competent authority of NIELIT, J&K Jammu, Prof. Pankaj Kumar Srivastava, Director, CDOE, Prof. Sandeep Kour Tandon, Director, CIQA, CDOE and Dr. Sumita Sharma, Joint Registrar, CDOE were present at the event.

Under the provisions of the MoU, both institutions shall collaboratively design and implement training programmes, workshops and certificate courses specifically aligned with the academic and professional requirements of learners enrolled in Distance Education programmes.

This collaboration will facilitate greater access to practical training, industry-oriented skills and professional exposure for learners, thereby contributing significantly to the enhancement of quality, relevance and outreach of distance education offered by CDOE, University of Jammu.

After thorough discussion, it was resolved that:

1. The eligibility conditions for admission in the Regular Departments of the University of Jammu shall be broadened for the courses also being run in the Centre for Distance & Online Education so that synchronization is maintained as per UGC REGULATIONS 2020
2. In principle, the matter pertaining to the weightage for different components of assessments for both Open and Distance Learning mode and Online mode shall be as under:
 - i. Continuous or formative assessment (in semester): Maximum 30 percent.

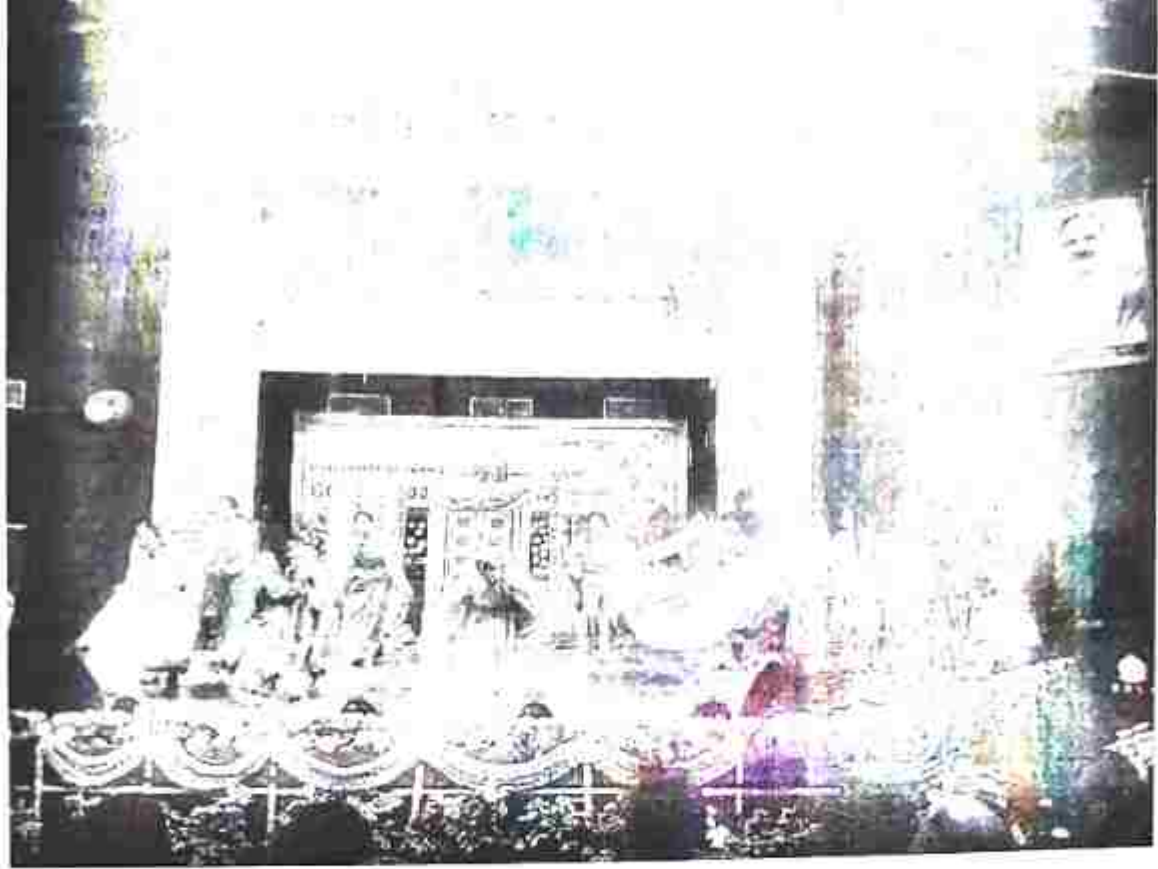

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MASTER OF COMMERCE (M.COM.)**1. INTRODUCTION**

M.Com. Programme aims to equip students with the knowledge, skills and competence to develop problem-solving aptitude towards the business and service issues; to meet challenges of the modern day-to-day business organizations and to mould them into future visionaries, management leaders and responsible citizens. The courses of M.Com. programme have been consistently revised and designed to promote better understanding in the students of the contemporary issues confronting the business world and the economy as a whole and instill in them the knowledge and capability of understanding the business world and its complexities. The programme helps in understanding traditional and non-traditional systems, policy framework and strategies needed to administer the rapid changes in an organisation's globally-oriented framework.

To accomplish its programme objectives, Department of Commerce provides a conducive environment that holistically engages students in comprehending and building sound theoretical foundation, research orientation, developing entrepreneurial skills; and formulating business operations.

2. STRUCTURE OF M.COM.

The M.Com. programme structure offers a deep dive into various facet of management and organisational development through integration of cross-cutting concepts and incorporation of relevant topics which accompany the dynamism attached to the business world. The overall structure of the course has been changed in the light of dynamic market changes to widen the scope and depth of the courses offered in the M.Com. The contents of the courses have been improved to provide an insight of research in functional areas like marketing, financial and human resources and other allied and interdisciplinary areas. The courses have been designed in line with outcome-based approach which requires specification of Course Outcomes and Course Learning Outcomes.

In the new structure, as per the area of interest, the students are required to choose two optional groups- one major group and one minor group, in the beginning of second year of the study. The structure for the groups has been designed with an intent to provide advanced level of specialisation in the respective field. The major group consists of four papers and minor group consists of two papers to be studied in third and fourth semesters in one of the three areas of finance & accounting; marketing and HRM. Under Choice Based Credit System, students will also study Open Elective courses offered by other departments of the University and MOOC. The contents of existing courses too have been revised in view of their contemporary requirements and relevance.

Jammu, Dec 2: The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), University of Jammu, inaugurated the first day of the Two-Day National Conference on "Re/Presentation of Women in Indian Literature" as part of its prestigious Golden Jubilee Celebrations. The event, held at the Brigadier Rajinder Singh Auditorium, University of Jammu witnessed an impressive gathering of scholars, academicians, researchers and students representing diverse institutions from across the region.

The conference was organised with the generous support of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA).

The programme commenced with the lighting of the ceremonial lamp, symbolising the pursuit of knowledge and enlightenment.

The inaugural ceremony was graced by Prof. J.P. Singh Joorel, Dean Academic Affairs, University of Jammu, who attended as the Chief Guest. Yet examples in ancient texts—such as Maitree and Gargi and even vivah mantras authored by women—clearly demonstrate that women held independent identities, voices, and contributions that shaped family, society and thought. Prof. Sudha Singh concluded that the true representation of women will emerge not merely through discussions, explorations or demonstrations, but through a deeper evolution of thought—an awakening of the collective mind that provokes reflection, challenges outdated perceptions and inspires meaningful change.

Prof. Anju Sharma, Convener of the Conference, enlightened the audience on the event's aim, highlighting the clear difference between the status of women in earlier times and their expanding roles in modern society. She emphasised that while women were once limited to narrow social and literary roles, they have now become influential voices shaping literature, culture and public life.

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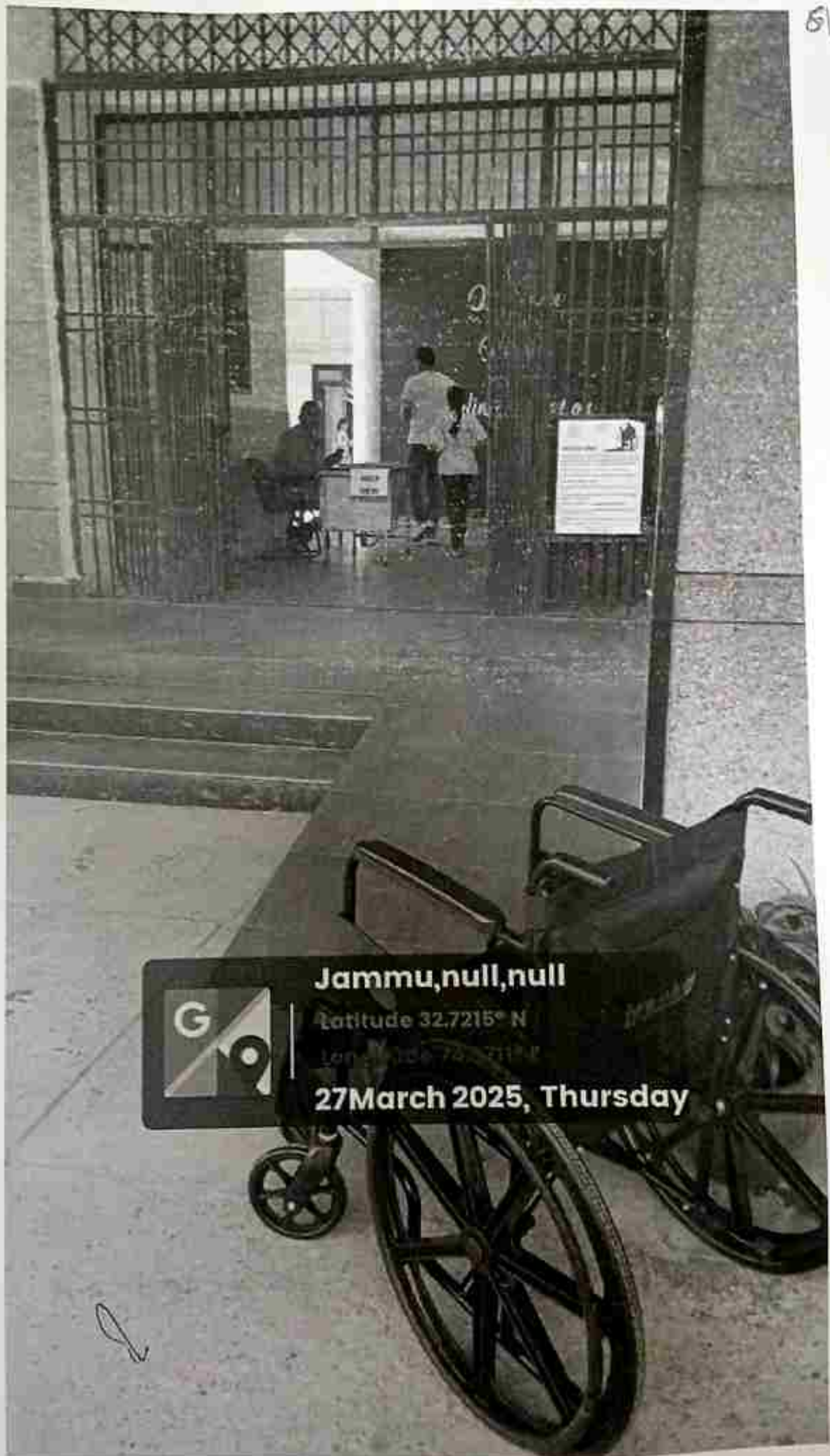

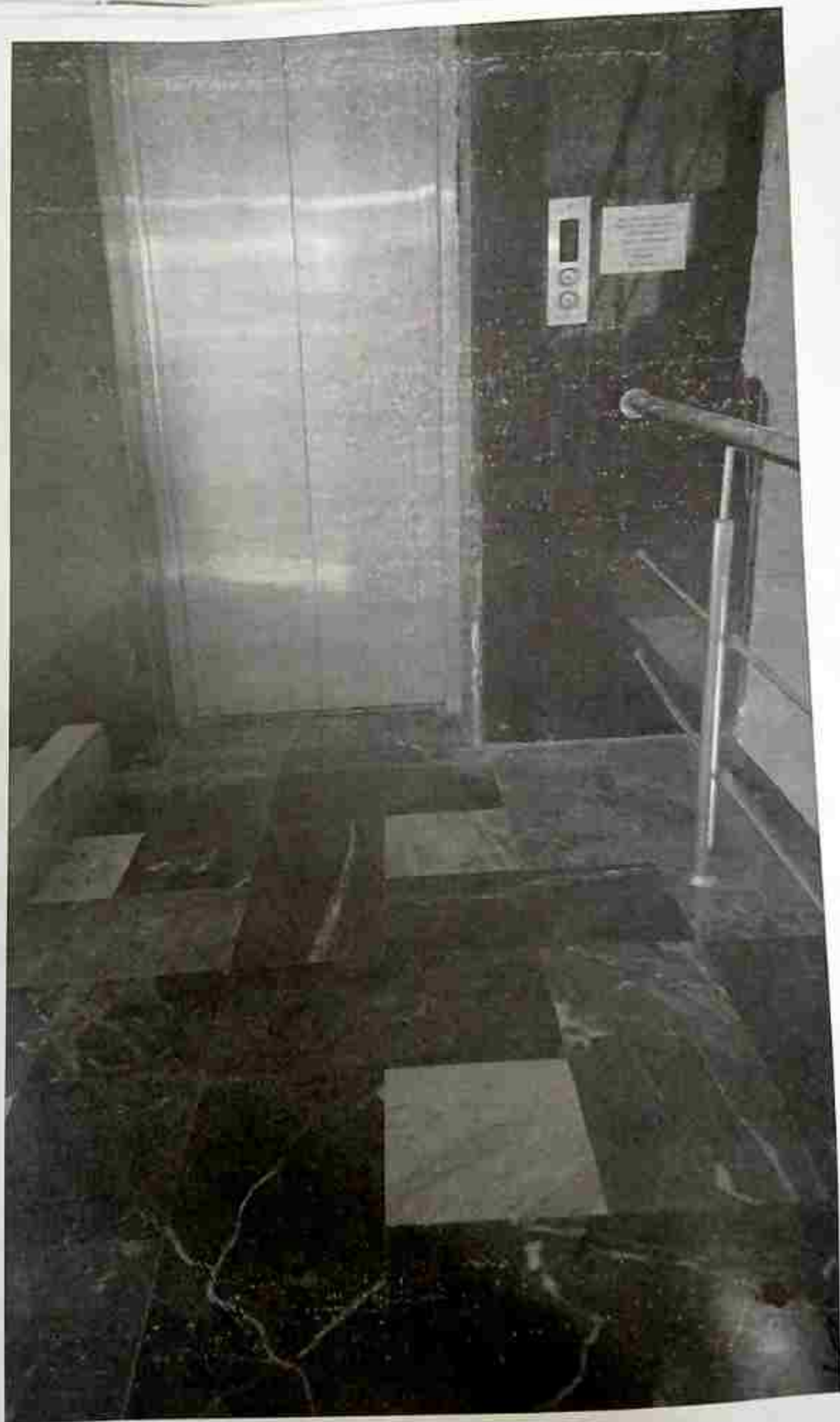

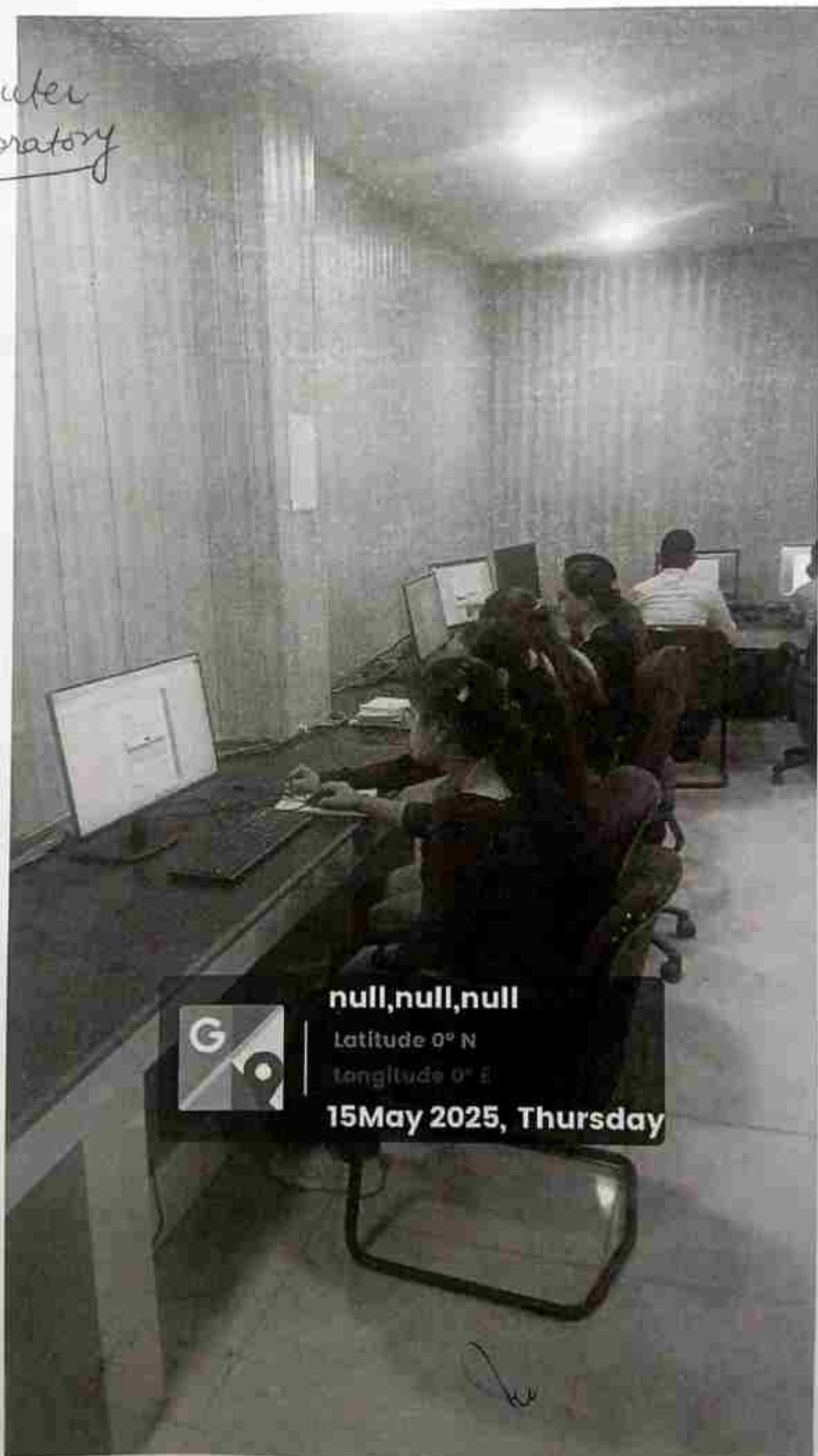
